## **Proceedings**

### **Introductions & Recap**

- Sarah Holland welcomed participants, led brief introductions
- Lauren Gray summarized Steering Committee's work to date
  - o Kick-off forum in May examined oral health data, developed population-specific priorities, outcome statements, and strategies to continue collaborating on as a regional steering committee (summarized here)
  - o Steering Committee meeting in July draft mission and vision statements as a group.
- Lauren reviewed the desired outcomes for today's meeting
  - To finalize mission and vision statements
  - o To agree on a set of core goals to work on
  - To identify a structure for the workgroup to implement collaborative strategies within each goal area

# **Discussion: Mission and Vision Statements**

- Between the July 31 and August 28 meetings, Steering Committee members submitted suggestions (via email to Lauren)
- VaOHC staff incorporated the suggestions, many of which overlapped:
  - o In both the mission and vision statements
    - Increase emphasis on "community" vs. "residents" or "consumers"
    - Focus on "upstream" factors we can tackle vs. "downstream"
  - Add more specificity to the activities outlined in the mission statement
- At the August 28 meeting, Steering Committee members were invited to approve the new mission and vision statements, and make any final changes
  - Theresa Caldwell: Is this applicable only to Richmond and Petersburg?
    - Lauren: No, can include adjacent counties; at the forum in May we had broader participation from surrounding counties. However, as the Steering Committee moves forward, may want to refine our definition of the geographic area we are working within.
  - Maghboeba Mosavel: Minimize the emphasis on access to care; current seems to heavily focused on access issues
  - o Lisette Johnson: Could emphasize "affordable" care, as well as accessible
  - Sarah Raskin: Broaden "community members" to include "stakeholders" more generally
  - Theresa Caldwell: And "policymakers"
- Consensus on final mission statement: Be a change agent for improving oral health among members of the Greater Richmond and Petersburg region by
  - Listening to the community's needs

- Advocating for better access to care
- Educating care consumers and providers on the importance of oral health for overall health, and
- Engaging with community members, policymakers, and other stakeholders to reduce barriers to dental care.
- Consensus on final vision statement: Greater Richmond and Petersburg area community members understand the importance of oral health as a part of overall health, and ultimately experience improved oral health outcomes.

## **Discussion: Measurable Outcomes & Workgroup Structure**

- Lauren introduced four outcomes/measurable goal areas to the group that were gleaned from the Richmond-Petersburg Area Oral Health Forum in May (summarized here), and which also were informed by activities already being undertaken by partners in the region
- Rather than discussing the specifics of each goal during the meeting, Lauren requested feedback on the general focus of the selected goal areas and a structure (e.g., subcommittees) to outline more detailed action plans for each goal
- Although the four goal areas are somewhat specific, VaOHC staff emphasized
  - The intent of narrowing to four goal areas is not to exclude or restrict other focus areas; the goal areas presented were commonly lifted up by multiple stakeholders, and represent immediate opportunities for collaboration
  - o It is important that the regional steering committee's work not be duplicative or supplant existing work going on in the region – steering committee members were encouraged to lift up existing partnerships, programs, and activities that could be leveraged to meet larger goals
- The comments focus area is outlined in the table below, along with the list of individuals who volunteered to participate in a subcommittee to work on each area.

### **Partner Updates**

- Lauren invited participants to introduce themselves if they arrived late or to share any updates with the larger group
- David Minoza, Jr., from J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College introduced himself and shared that JSRCC has a dental assisting program
- Leslie Crocker, with CARES in Petersburg, introduced herself and shared that the
- Sharon Logue, from the VDH Dental Health program, shared that their preventive dental services are being offered to all Richmond public schools
- Jernice Giles, Dental Director at the Daily Planet, shared that the Daily Planet is partnering with Richmond City Health District to provide dental care to all their pregnant patients, and they are also offering pediatric dental counseling to parents at the same time.
- Shillpa Naavaal, VCU School of Dentistry, shared that her department is coordinating with the Centering Pregnancy program at VCU to accept all of their dental referrals.
- JoAnn Wells, from VDH Dental Health program, shared that national partners from the Association of Maternal & Child Health Programs and other organizations will be conducting a

technical assistance site visit this week to advise on VDH & VaOHC's programs to improve dental care utilization among pregnant women and infants

- Subcommittees will meet simultaneously on the last Monday of each month
- Subcommittees will determine co-chairs preferably two individuals, one with direct service experience and one with more policy/admin experience
- Steering Committee will elect co-chairs
