Joint Commission on Healthcare Study: Cost of Untreated Dental Disease in the Commonwealth

The Joint Commission on Healthcare recently presented an [overview](#) of its study regarding the economic impact of oral health issues in the Commonwealth.



Of note:

- More than one-third of adults do not have dental insurance. Studies show that children are more likely to visit the dentist if their parents have dental coverage.
- Low-income adults are more likely to seek dental care on an emergency or as-needed basis.
- More Virginians are utilizing the adult Medicaid dental benefit, which is limited to emergency dental extractions.

As a next step, Commission members will vote November 18 on which policy options they will recommend to Virginia's General Assembly ([see page 20](#) to view the options). In addition to these five policy options, Virginia Secretary of Health and Human Resources, Dr. William Hazel, requested that the report also include a policy option to extend comprehensive Medicaid dental benefits to pregnant women.

Medicaid Innovation Reform Commission Considers Medicaid Expansion in Virginia

The Medicaid Innovation and Reform Commission (the Commission) met twice in October for a public hearing (Oct. 15) and for a regularly scheduled meeting (Oct. 21).

During the public hearing, 103 individuals offered public comment - of these, 75 individuals indicated support of Medicaid expansion and 28 expressed opposition. The

Commission has received over 2,000 written public comments; the majority indicate support of Medicaid expansion.

If Medicaid expands to cover individuals up to 133 percent of the federal poverty level (~\$15,282 for a single adult), over 400,000 Virginians will be eligible for an emergency extraction dental benefit, which will likely reduce reliance on emergency department use for dental-related issues.

At the Oct. 21 meeting, in an update to the Commission about the progress Virginia has made implementing Medicaid reforms, Secretary Hazel stated that the Commonwealth has "arguably" implemented all of the reform requirements that must be in place if Virginia is to expand Medicaid. The Commission will meet again after the [gubernatorial election](#) to continue to evaluate reform progress.
