#### **PPE Shortages**

- Providers should reach out to their **local** health departments to ensure that they are aware of PPE needs (not the state VDH office, or the state dental program)
- If you don't have a known contact, check here

#### Airbone v. droplet precautions

- Droplet precautions
- Airborne precautions
- If a patient is COVID (+) or a PUI and requires dental treatment, this treatment must be completed following **airborne precautions** 
  - See <u>CDC guidance</u>
- It is important to note that most dental offices are *not* equipped with proper engineering controls required of airborne precautions
- If you have a patient that requires treatment with airborne precautions, you will need to refer that patient to to a clinic equipped with airborne precautions requirements

## Community

The CDC has released a <u>Self-Checker</u> to help individuals make decisions and see medical care when appropriate. Note this is to guide patients in terms of seeking *medical* attention related to COVID-19, not dental emergencies.

• This Self Checker can be embedded as a <u>widget</u> on your community health center's website

The American Red Cross is asking for plasma donations from recovered COVID-19 patients.

- People who have fully recovered from COVID-19 have antibodies in their plasma that can attack the virus
- This convalescent plasma is being evaluated as treatment for patients with serious or immediately life-threatening COVID-19 infections, or those judged by a healthcare provider to be at high risk of progression to severe or life-threatening disease
