2020 State and Federal Policy Update

This has been a busy month for state and federal policy. Of note:

- <u>Adult Dental in Medicaid:</u> It is crucial that over the next week legislators hear from all of us about the importance of adding an adult dental benefit to Medicaid. A script for phone calls is available <u>here</u>, along with contact information for crucial delegates who will be deciding whether an adult dental benefit is included in the budget. <u>Please take a few</u> <u>minutes to contact legislators today.</u>
- Public Charge Ruling: This week the Supreme Court ruled that the Trump administration's "public charge" rule can take effect while legal challenges to it make their way through the courts system. The "public charge" rule would make it harder for immigrants to get a green card if they use public benefits like Medicaid or SNAP. Our partners at Families USA shared the following points regarding the "public charge" rule:
 - DHS's Public Charge regulation does not affect all immigrants. Refugees, asylees, survivors of trafficking, domestic violence and other serious crimes, and other "humanitarian" immigrants are not affected.
 - Use of public benefits will not automatically make an immigrant a public charge. Immigration officials must look at all circumstances in determining whether someone is likely to become a public charge in the future.

> Save the Date! The <u>2020</u> <u>Virginia Oral</u> <u>Health</u> <u>Summit</u>will take place on

- Life-saving food and nutrition programs like WIC, CHIP, school lunches, food banks, shelters, childcare assistance and many more are not included in the public charge test.
- Benefits that children receive will <u>not</u> count against an immigrant parent if their green card application is processed in the U.S.
- While the rule is permitted to take effect, it is important to remember that this fight is by no means over. The appellate cases are moving on expedited schedules and could be decided within a couple of months.
- Medicaid Block Grants: The Trump administration has released a new guidance which allows states to block-grant their Medicaid programs. Under the new guidance, states can apply for a waiver, which if granted, would give the state more discretion on how to operate its Medicaid program. While this may sound positive, the intent is not. Block-granting Medicaid would reduce resources and could have a significant negative impact on the health of Medicaid enrollees.
