Recent Virginia-Specific Medicaid Policy Changes

- Expanded access to **telehealth services,** including allowing Medicaid reimbursement for providers who use telehealth with patients in the home this will likely include teledentistry services. More details to come!
- All **co-payments** for services covered by Medicaid and Family Access to Medical Insurance Security (FAMIS), including COVID-19-related treatment as well as other medical care have been **eliminated.**
- Current Medicaid members **will not lose coverage** due to lapses in paperwork or a change in circumstances.
- Medicaid members may now obtain a **90-day supply of many routine prescriptions**, an increase from the 30-day supply under previous rules.
- **Pre-approval requirements** for many critical medical services have been **waived**, and there are automatic extensions for approvals that are already in place.

- NNOHA coronavirus resource center (NNOHA - National Network of Oral Health Access)

The NNOHA resource center compiles resources for health care professionals from a number of sources, including the CDC, HRSA, and WHO. Additionally, the resource center includes guidelines and recommendations for each state.

- Coronavirus resource center for Dentists (ADA American Dental Association). This is specific to dental providers and offers resources like checklists for providers to determine what constitutes an emergency procedure, how to stay protected during treatment, and sample communications for patients.

This is the hub of resources from the CDC, it is updated regularly to reflect the changing situation. Healthcare professionals can find the latest interim guidance on treating patients under investigation (PUI), clinical care, and infection control.

During this COCA Call, presenters focused on current information about COVID-19 as it relates to children and pregnant women. Topics included infection prevention and control measures in inpatient obstetric healthcare settings and resources available to care for pediatric patients.

Funding Resources

- Community Foundation

The Community Foundation, in partnership with the Emergency Management Alliance of Central Virginia, has created the Central Virginia COVID-19 Response Fund. There is no formal application process for the fund.

- Richmond Memorial Health Foundation

Richmond Memorial Health Foundation has extended the deadline for grants and has encouraged current grantees to reach out about repurposing grant funding in light of COVID-19.

Catalyst is monitoring for additional funding information, in the meantime grantees are encouraged to reach out to specific foundations with questions about existing grants.
