Adult Dental is IN!

During the special session, legislators heard from Virginians all across the commonwealth about the need for a dental benefit for adults enrolled in Medicaid, and in large part because of your grassroots engagement – **funding for an adult dental benefit was included in the budget**! The Governor needs to sign the budget – and Catalyst staff will watch the next steps closely. You can learn a bit more about what comes next <u>here</u>.

As Catalyst's CEO shared in a recent <u>Virginia Mercury article</u>, the budget reflects the values of the commonwealth, and the decision by legislators to reallott funding demonstrates that the members' value equitable access to comprehensive health care that includes oral health.
