Virginia and Federal Policy Updates Ahead of 2020

Join Virginia Health Catalyst and partners from across the commonwealth for <u>Legislative Action</u> <u>Day</u> on January 28 to advocate for a comprehensive dental benefit for all adults enrolled in Medicaid. We need this to be our largest Legislative Action Day yet to show legislators the importance of adding an adult dental benefit! Register to attend <u>here</u>.

Heading into the legislative session, Virginia Health Catalyst is monitoring the following issues:

- Governor Northam's Budget: This week Governor Northam released his biennial budget. While his budget includes funding for programs that will improve the health and wellbeing of Virginians, it does not include funding for a comprehensive adult dental benefit in Medicaid. The budget does include \$200 million in unallocated funds some of which could be allocated for an adult dental benefit. Virginia Health Catalyst will move forward in supporting a budget amendment, but we need the support of health advocates across Virginia to make a dental benefit a reality. - DMAS Study Highlights ED Use for Dental Issues: Last week a study by the Virginia Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) found nearly 16,000 Medicaid recipients visited the emergency department (ED) roughly 19,000 times for dental-related issues in 2018. What's more, the study found

We know that nearly one-third of adults enrolled in Medicaid have cited access to dental care as their biggest unmet need.  House of Representatives Passes Bill Supporting Oral Health in Medicare: The House of Representatives recently passed HR 3, a package of health reforms that would fund a dental benefit in Medicare for the millions of enrolled Americans. While this is an important accomplishment, the legislation is not likely to pass out of the Senate. Regardless, oral health legislation has become a priority at the federal level, which is a testament to the great work of health advocates across the country.

Your support in 2020 for an adult dental benefit is crucial. As the DMAS study shows, a dental benefit will not only improve health outcomes, it could save the state money on avoidable ED visits. Virginia Health Catalyst Launches Integration Resource Center



This month Virginia Health Catalyst launched an online <u>Integration Resource Center</u> to share tools and resources with Virginia's health care community that highlight opportunities for care integration. Oral Health Value-based Care Readiness Assessment



The DentaQuest Partnership designed an online <u>Oral Health Value-based Care Readiness</u> <u>Assessment</u> to help dental safety net providers evaluate areas of growth and proficiency ahead of the anticipated transition to an oral health value-based care (OHVBC) reimbursement model. Those who complete the assessment will

Study Finds Link Between Oral Hygiene and Heart Failure

A <u>new study</u> in the European Journal of Preventive Cardiology found that individuals who brushed their teeth at least three times a day had a lower risk of heart failure or atrial fibrillation (AFib).
