



Justice in Aging released a new issue brief highlighting how a dental benefit in Medicare would address racial disparities. Given that black older adults experience complete tooth loss at over two times the rate of white older adults (31% vs 15%) adding a dental benefit could reduce disparities in access to care and overall health. In addition to the findings, the issue brief provides additional ways to address disparities, including diversifying the health care workforce and integrating care. Nearly 48 Million Adults Across United States Forego Dental Care Annually



<u>New data</u> from the American Dental Association Health Policy Institute finds about 1 in 5 workingage adults report needing dental care but did not obtain it in the past year. This rate was higher among older adults. As we might expect, the most commonly cited reason for not accessing dental care was cost. Support Catalyst's efforts to ensure more Virginians have access to dental services by adding a comprehensive dental
