Measuring Oral Health Success to Improve Outcomes

The Uniform Data System (UDS) is the standardized reporting system used annually by every federally qualified health center to report data, such as dental sealant rates, and assist in measuring outcomes.

Potential changes to UDS:

HHS, and HRSA (the Health Resources and Services Administration) are considering changes to the measures used in UDS. Of particular interest to Virginia Health Catalyst and its partners are changes to:

- Sealant Measure: Currently, UDS measures the percentage of children age 6-9 who have received dental sealants, but HHS and HRSA have proposed replacing this metric with a fluoride varnish application measure. Dental sealants are a thin plastic coating that acts as a barrier to prevent tooth decay and are an incredibly effective and inexpensive way to prevent cavities; in Virginia, 52% of third graders have a sealant. Virginia Health Catalyst and its partners recommend maintaining the current measure for dental sealants.
- Diabetes Measures: As part of the proposed changes, HHS and HRSA are considering adding additional diabetes measures to

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include eye and foot exams and screenings for nephropathy. While these measures are important, patients with diabetes cannot fully control their A1C levels without good oral health. For that reason, Virginia Health Catalyst and its partners recommend adding an oral health screening to the diabetes measures.

Our friends at The National Network for Oral Health Access <u>submitted a comment</u> regarding the potential changes, which Virginia Health Catalyst endorsed.

What can I do to improve oral health metrics in Virginia?

In Virginia, advocates can join one of Virginia Health Catalyst's <u>statewide committees</u>, like the <u>School-Based Health Workgroup</u> that is identifying and implementing initiatives to improve sealant rates, or a <u>regional oral health</u> <u>alliance</u> which are improving population health outcomes through population-specific workgroups. Kaiser Family Foundation Recommends Ways to Improve Oral Health Care in Medicare, Including Adding Dental Benefit

Report Finds Sugary Drinks Linked to Increased Risk of Death from All Causes

A new report studied the long term health impacts of sugary drinks and found

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that consuming sugar sweetened beverages increased mortality rates, even among participants with a healthy weight. To help providers, community health workers, and home visitors improve the health of their clients, Virginia Health Catalyst created a white paper on strategies to encourage individuals to drink fluoridated water.
