Upcoming Federal Policies Could Improve the Health of Virginians

Congress is considering multiple policy changes in the fourth stimulus package that, if enacted, will have a lasting impact on the health of Virginians. One of the proposed changes is increasing the amount of money the federal government pays for state Medicaid programs, known as the FMAP. You can learn more about it <u>here</u>.

When Congress passed the CARES Act it included a temporary 6% FMAP increase, but it will expire when the national public health emergency ends. Catalyst and health advocates across the country are hopeful that Congress will enact a longer, and larger, FMAP increase in the fourth stimulus package.

With expected revenue shortfalls, an FMAP increase will free up state dollars that could fund initiatives that were unalloted in the budget, such as an adult dental benefit in Medicaid.

CDC Updates Interim Guidelines

The CDC has updated its interim guidelines for dental settings as more dental providers reopen. Some of the changes include:

- Removal of wait times: In the most recent update the CDC removed its recommendation to wait 15 minutes in between patient visits to allow for disinfecting the room.
- Patient communication time reduced: Patients are now required to inform a dental provider of any COVID-19 symptoms two days after their visit.
